

☐ 1. Selecting the signature and encryption certificates in Outlook 2003

To digitally sign and encrypt an email message you need to select the digital certificates to be used and the corresponding private key. These may reside in the computer hard disk, on a cryptographic card or on other supports. If the certificates are on a cryptographic card it must be inserted into the card reader before opening Outlook 2003 email client.

First, select the certificates with which you wish to sign and encrypt.

Go to "Tools" \rightarrow "Options" \rightarrow "Security" tab. In the Encrypted E-Mail section, press the Settings button to select the signing and encryption certificates.



Click on the "Choose" button, located to the right of "Signing Certificate" in the "Change Security Settings" window that appears.



Select the signing certificate.

Next, click on the "Choose" button, located to the right of "Encryption Certificate", to select the encryption certificate.






□ 2. Signing an email message in Outlook 2003

To sign an email message, go to the New Mail window and click on the icon that is circled in the following image. If the button is enabled, the message will be digitally signed.




Note: Every time we want to sign using a certificate stored on a cryptographic card, the card must be inserted into the reader before opening Outlook 2003.




